Chatham House Rule

When a meeting, or part thereof, is held under the Chatham House Rule, participants are free to use the information received, but neither the identity nor the affiliation of the speaker(s), nor that of any other participant, may be revealed.

The Rule explained

- Used effectively, the Chatham House Rule helps to bring people together, break down barriers, generate ideas and agree solutions.
- Meetings do not have to take place at Chatham House, or be organized by Chatham House, to be held under the Rule.
- Any group of individuals in any sector can use the Rule as a pre-agreed guide for running an event, especially when sensitive issues will be discussed.
